Subject: reimbursement Barry Hancock in 2008.

During the meeting of the Executive Committee in Kiev there was a discussion with regard to the reimbursement of Barry Hancock for work done for the IAP in 2008. According to the 2008 financial statements compiled by Ernst & Young, the total reimbursement was €11.584.

The Secretary-General was asked to clarify this matter for discussion during the Committee meeting in Prague.

The minutes of the Executive Committee Northern Spring Meeting in Santiago in 2007 read (item 10):

*'The General Counsel presented his report and explained his decision to retire in Hong Kong. He would not be disappearing from the IAP but would continue to provide assistance. Carlos Donoso Castex paid tribute to the work done by the General Counsel. **Retha Meintjes wanted to retain the services of the General Counsel in an advisory capacity and this was accepted.***

On the basis of this agreement by the Executive Committee, Barry kept on doing work for the Association in 2008, which was devoted to the review of the first edition of the IAP Human Rights Manual and the preparation of the second edition, and to the writing and editing of the Standards for Prosecutors Volume II.

In connection with this work he travelled to Copenhagen to meet with Janne Holst Hubner and Henning Fode and to Holland to meet with a Procurator General.

He also travelled to Rome to represent the Association at the ILAC meeting; Barry was a boardmember of ILAC (in his capacity of IAP General Counsel, a position now taken over by the present General Counsel).

The appr. 200 working hours (x GBP 30 = GBP 6.000 x €1,40 = €8.400) plus travel costs and costs of equipment indeed make a total of €11.584.

It should be stated that in 2009 and 2010 Barry did not charge any expenses, as he is now fully retired and was not asked by the Secretary-General and/or General Counsel to give assistance.
