

Chris Toth is NAAG deputy executive director and NAGTRI director. He received his B.A., *cum laude*, from New York University, and his J.D., *cum laude from* the University of Notre Dame Law School. After graduating from New York University, Chris attended Naval Aviation Officer Candidate School and received his commission as an ensign in the U.S. Navy. He served several tours on active duty in the US Navy before attending law school.

Following law school, Chris served as a uniformed NCIS agent, judicial clerk, deputy prosecuting attorney, and in private legal practice. Chris also was elected and served as the prosecuting attorney in St. Joseph County (South Bend) Indiana. In addition to serving as a naval officer on both active duty and the reserves, Chris also served both on active duty and in the reserves as an US Army officer, recently retiring from the US Army Reserves.

In 2004, Chris became deputy executive director of the National Association of Attorneys General (NAAG), and in 2007 took on the additional title of director of the National Attorneys General Training and Research Institute (NAGTRI). He supervises support for NAAG committees in the areas of antitrust, consumer protection, criminal law, cyberspace law, and energy and environment, among others. He also supervises the Tobacco Project, which coordinates enforcement of the 1998 Master Settlement Agreement between the major tobacco manufacturers and 46 states, as well as the Supreme Court Project, which prepares state attorneys to argue before the U.S. Supreme Court.

Chris is a member of the executive committee of the International Association of Prosecutors.
