

Krishen Mehta is a former partner with PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC), and serves currently on the Advisory Board of Aspen Institute's Business and Society Program, and as a Global Justice Fellow at Yale University.

Krishen is also a Senior Advisor to the Tax Justice Network, and is one of the non-executive Directors of that organization. He is on the Asia Advisory Council of Human Rights Watch, and serves as trustee of the Korbel School of International Studies at the University of Denver. He is also a Board Member of the Institute of Current World Affairs in Washington, DC, and is one of the founders of Asia Initiatives, a US 501(C)(3) organization engaged on developmental projects in various countries in South Asia.

Krishen has an undergraduate degree in Engineering, a Masters in Business Administration, and is a US CPA.

Since 2009, Krishen has been actively engaged on issues relating to the structural roots of global inequality - the relationship between tax policy, illicit financial flows, and poverty - and the effect it has on both developed and developing countries. He served till 2012 as Co-Chairman of Global Financial Integrity (GFI), a research and advocacy group at the Center for International Policy, in Washington, DC.

Krishen was an Adjunct Professor at American University's School of International Service in Washington, DC, in 2012. He has been an invited speaker at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University, and at the Executive Management Program at Tokyo University. He has conducted Capstone research projects at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs in New York. In 2013 Krishen was honored as a Master Scholar by the Daniels School of Business at the University of Denver.

Krishen writings have been published in the International Herald Tribune, the Japan Times, the Dallas Morning News, and various magazines on issues of tax and global justice.
