Mr. Rashid Ahmine studied for his law degree in the UK at the **University of Liverpool** where he obtained his LLB in 1992. He was called at the Mauritian Bar in December 1994. He joined the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** in February 1995 as State Counsel. During his term of office, he has been occupying the posts of Senior State Counsel, Principal State Counsel and Assistant Parliamentary Counsel respectively.

In 2004 he was awarded the British Chevening Scholarship to study for an LLM. He holds a Masters in Banking & Finance Law from **King's College London**.

Mr Ahmine was awarded the Prosecutor of the Year Award 2012 by the **International Association of Prosecutors** for his outstanding performance in the fight against crimes both domestically and internationally and for successfully promoting international cooperation and human rights.

Mr Ahmine currently holds the post of Senior Assistant Director of Public Prosecutions at the **Office of the DPP** in Mauritius. He is responsible for Anti Money Laundering/CFT matters.
