RIGHTS OF THE ACCUSED

To know the Accusation To be tried in his presence To take evidence in his presence To cross examine Prosecution Witness **To Produce evidence in Defense** To have reasoned decision To get the Benefit of Doctrines of **Autrefois Acquit and Autrefois Convict**

PROTECTION OF VICTIM / WITNESS

 According to Bentham, "witnesses are the eyes and ears of justice".

• Each and every statement of theirs is very important as it has a magic force to change the course of the whole case.

Why Witness turn Hostile?

- i) Threat/intimidation
- ii) Inducement by various means
- iii) Allurement/seduction
- *iv) Disillusionment caused by the delay in the judicial process*

UN guidelines of Victims and Witness to be treated with respect and recognition

- to be referred to adequate support services
- to receive information about the progress of the case
- to be present and to be involved in the decision-making process
- to counsel & to protection of physical safety and privacy
- to compensation, both from the offender and the court.

Best Bakery Case

3 categories of witnesses

 victim-witnesses who are known to the accused;

- victims-witnesses not known to the accused (e.g.as in a case of indiscriminate firing by the accused) and
- witnesses whose identity is not known to the accused.

Witness Identity Protection

At the stage of investigation:

(*ii*) During inquiry and before recording evidence at the trial:

(*iii*) Recording evidence during the trial in the Sessions Court: twoway closed circuit television

Victimology & Compensation to the Victims

Victim Witness Assistance Programmes

To enlighten Citizen on laws

- To help the victims to overcome difficulties in language,
- To advice them on the problems
- To provide basic information

Basic Information to WITNESS

- date of hearing
- name of other witness
- date of adjournment if any
- mode of transport
- assistance available for Women & accompanying Children
- Facilities available for Victims in the Court hall etc.
- Provision to get Leave from employer to attend Court
- Preparation for the trial
- Provision for Victim Compensation and Travelling Expense from Court
- Information regarding the result of the Case and Subsequent actions.
- Protection for the Victim/Witness
- Counseling to overcome the trauma
