Definition of a Juvenile



According to Federal Law No. (9) of 1976 for Delinquent Juveniles and vagrants **(he one who didn't reach the age of 18 years of the Calendar Year at the time of committing the crime subject of the accountability or he has been found in one of the circumstances of homelessness.)**



Causes of creating Juvenile Prosecution

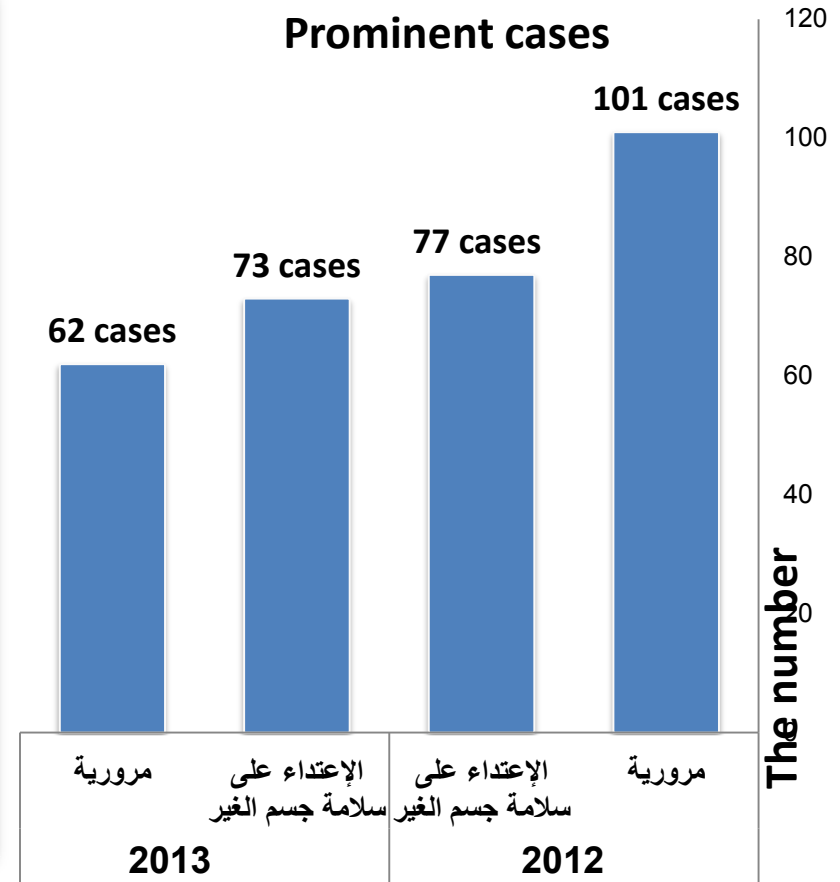
Family or juvenile prosecution is a part of Public Prosecution concerned with investigation and accusation for the crimes committed by the juveniles and crimes amongst the one family up to the fourth degree of consanguinity. The department of family and juveniles pertains to this Prosecution and is assigned to prepare reports about the state of juveniles before referring them to court.

Among the most important causes:

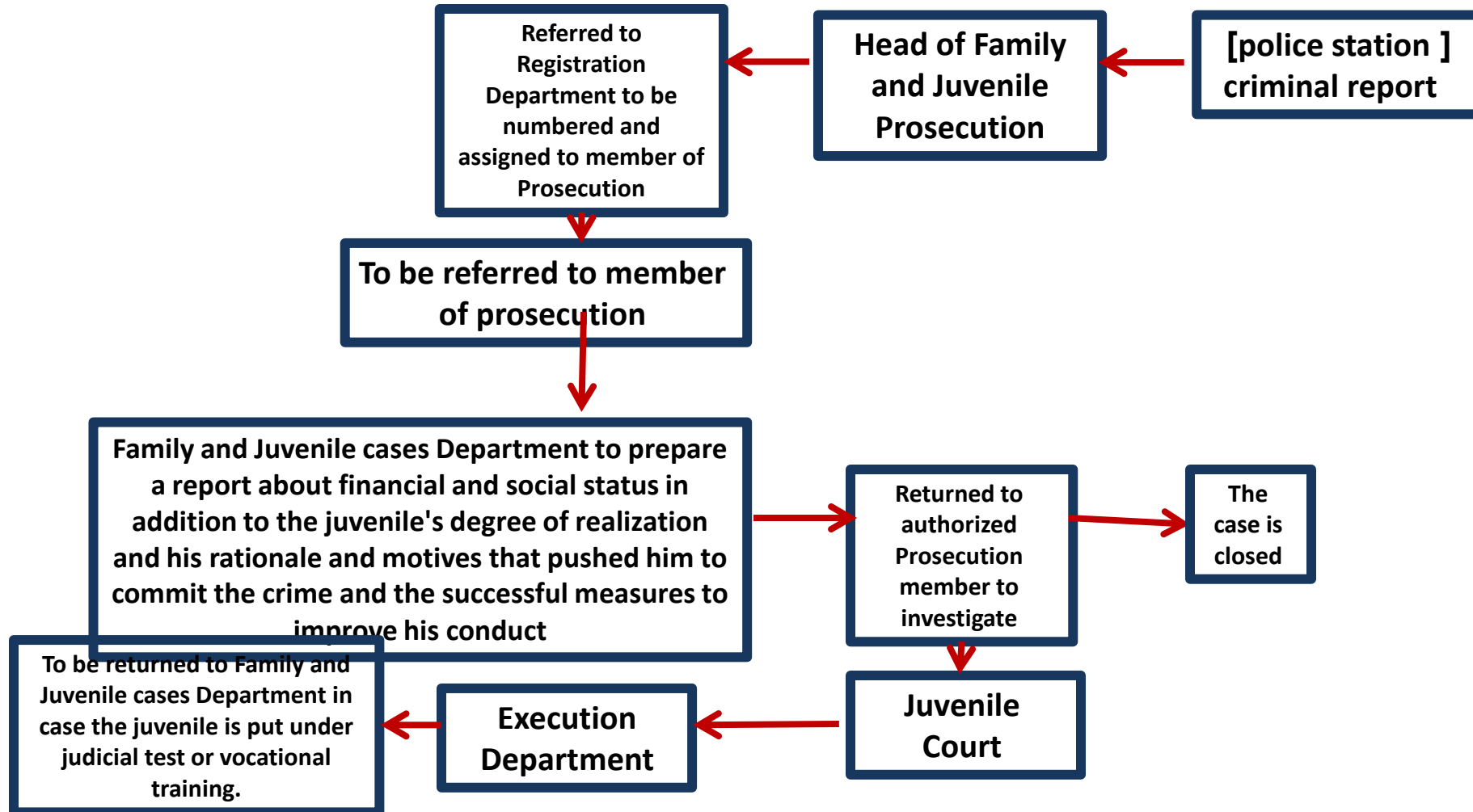
- Sophistication of crimes committed by juveniles.
- Existence of a court of juveniles and relation of its decrees to reports prepared by Department of Family and Juvenile Cases in the Public Prosecution.
- Existence of a legal system dedicated to juveniles..
- Seeking a development of judicial, social and informational endeavors associated with such category..

Causes driving juveniles to delinquency

1. Family negligence and breakups .
2. Bad friendships.
3. Negative behavior in spending leisure time.
4. Lack of coordination and communication with school (and other places taking care of juveniles such as sports clubs) and family.
5. Misuse of Social Media.
6. High cost of living and increase of uncensored technological entertaining means.



Punishments inflicted upon juveniles

The judge punishes the juvenile by one or more of the measures provided by article 15 of the law as follows::

1. scolding.
2. repatriation.
3. Judicial probation.
4. Prohibition of certain places frequentation.
5. prohibition of certain work.
6. obligation of vocational training.
7. Committing him to rehabilitation institute, education house, reformation or therapeutic center if necessary.
8. banishment.



The juvenile who exceeded 16 years of age at the time he committed the crime shall be punished by the judge by imprisonment for a term not more than ten years.

Factors that limit juvenile delinquency

1. Family care and follow-up of children.
2. Good choice of companions and friends.
3. Reinforcement of family and kinship links.
4. Activating the role of school in surveiling the juveniles.
5. Developing the work of bodies and institutions related to juvenile category and giving priority to awareness and follow-up programs .
6. Charging juveniles with tasks and missions suitable to their age bracket and following and supporting them to accomplish the desired goals.



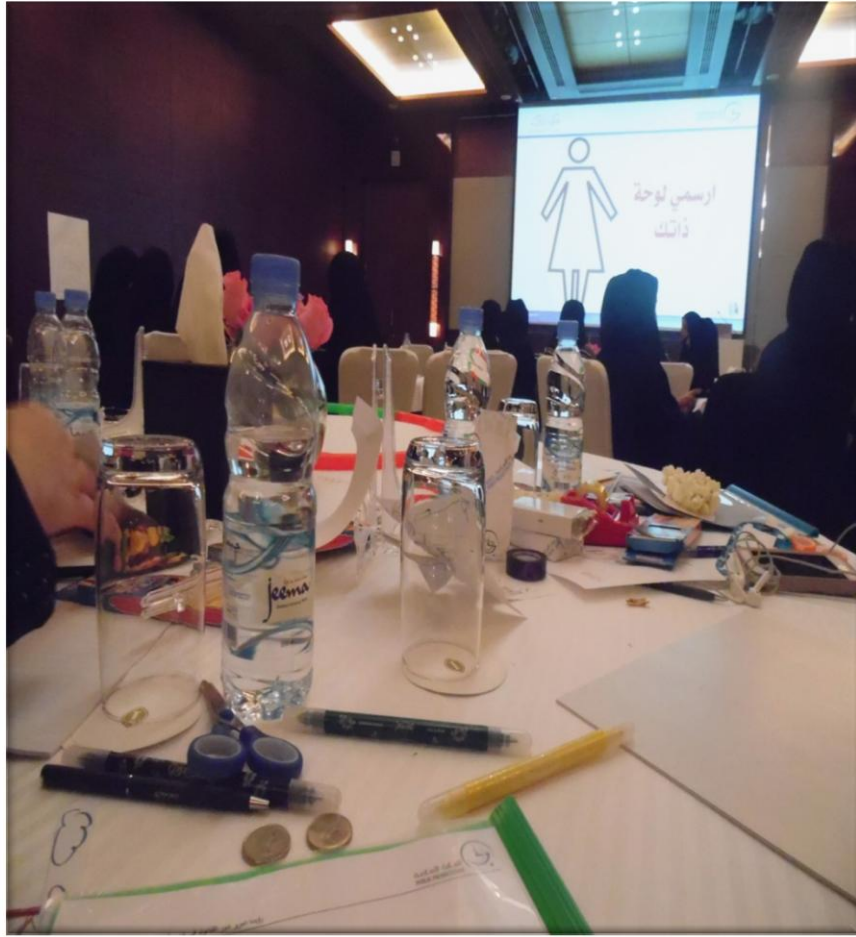

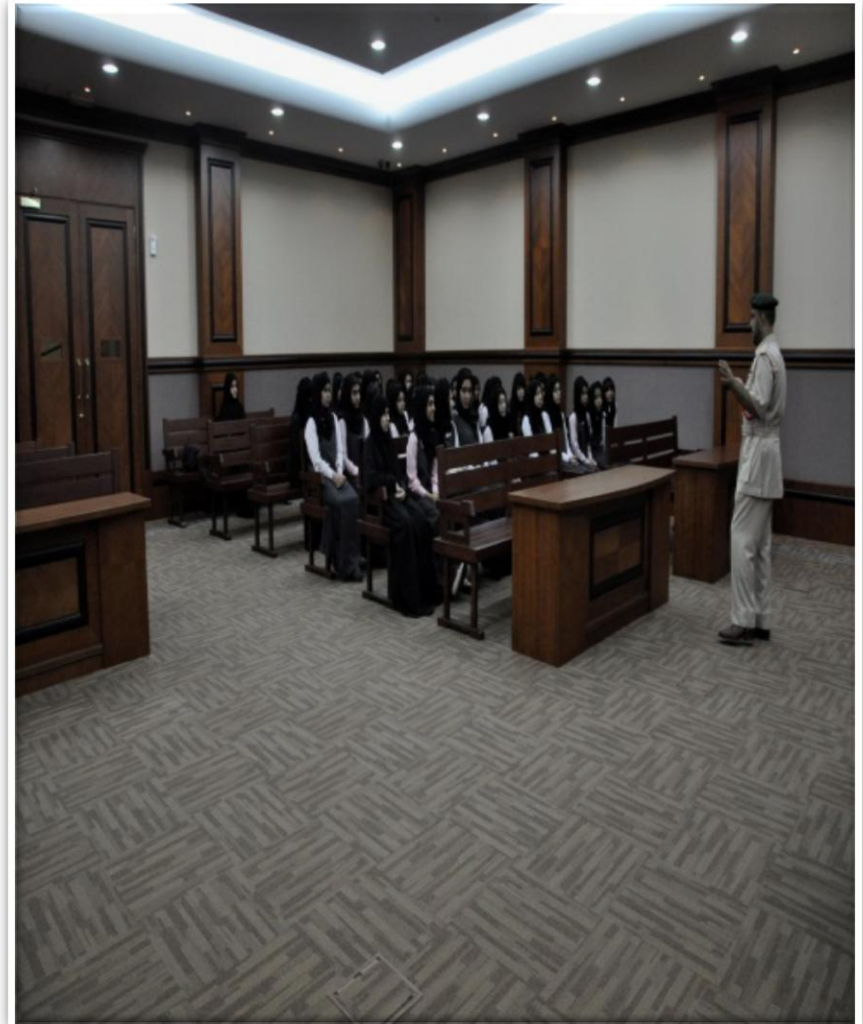

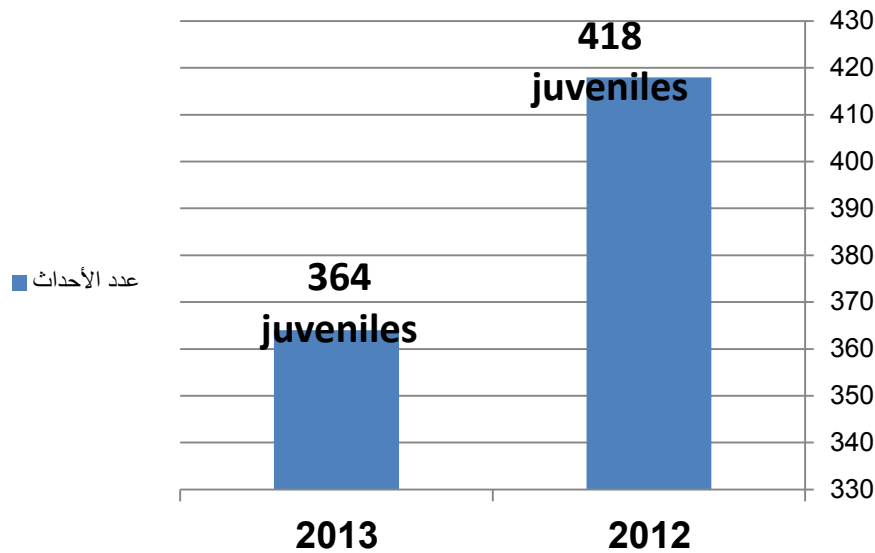

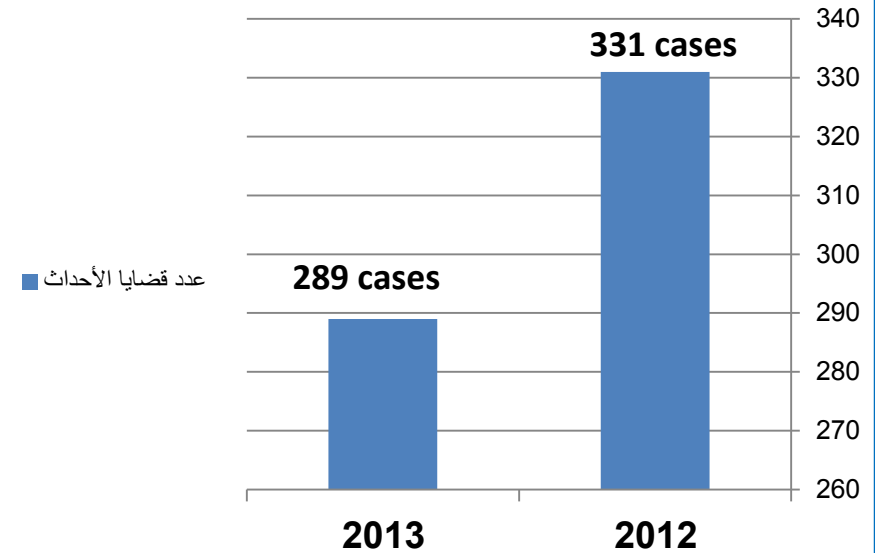

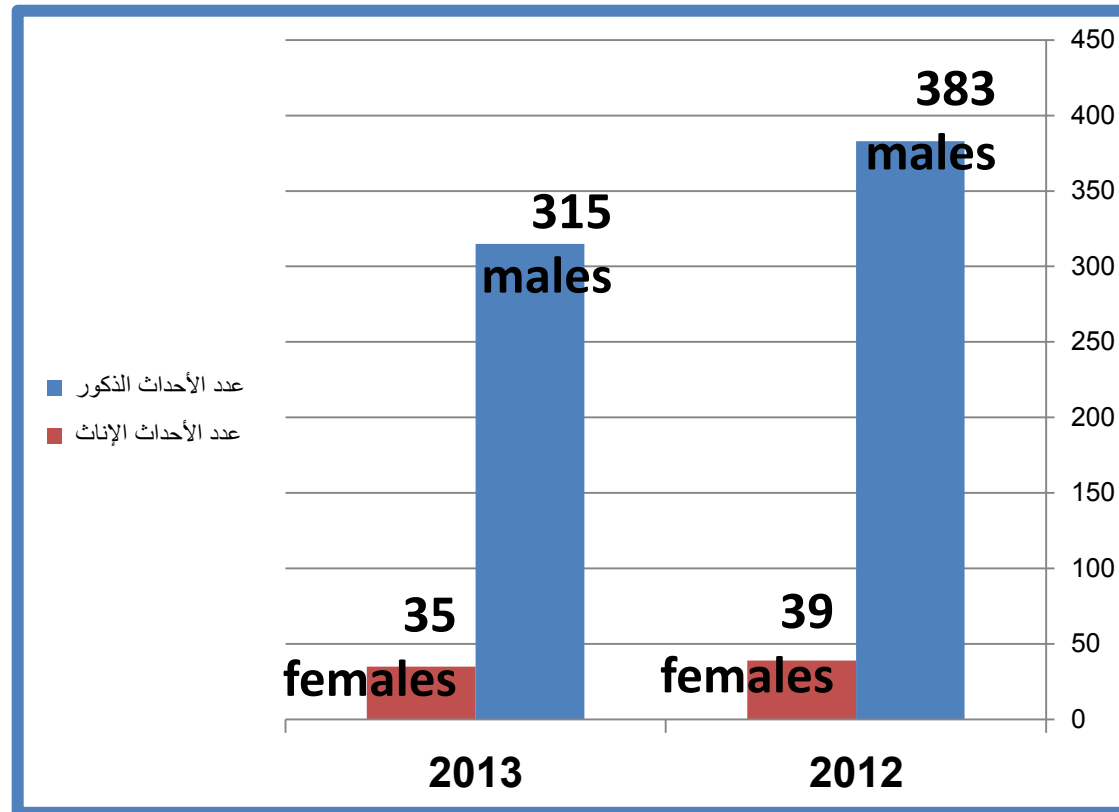
Number of juveniles
