

# Outcome of 19th Annual Conference and General Meeting of the IAP, Dubai, 2014

RECOMMENDATIONS TO MEMBERS

Explore the creation and development of specialist virtual networks as need, demand and available resources allow Examples:

- (a) Network for counter terrorism prosecutors a forum in which prosecutors can exchange national experiences, identify common challenges and discuss ways to address them and share and promote good practices.
- (b)Network of practitioners on conflict related sexual violence crimes pooling expertise from International Tribunals and courts and domestic jurisdictions
  - Specialised network for Heads of Prosecution Services to share information of mutual interest
  - Performance indicators used to raise performance of service
  - Performance indicators to measure individual performance of prosecutors
  - Policies and legislative initiatives dealing with rights of victims within criminal justice systems

Organisational members to ensure that IAP contact points are an authoritative and effective single point of contact for IAP to facilitate and enhance the relationship between the membership of the IAP and in particular to advance the engagement of their members and specialists within the IAP's specialist websites



Promote the recognition and prosecution of Hate Crime / Discriminatory Crime through promulgation of OSCE / IAP Guide on Prosecution of Hate Crime and associated training



Promote the contribution of Prosecutor Associations organisational members towards advancing the objectives of the IAP and support a conference for Associations to be held under the auspices of the IAP
