



Nathan Brooks is USDOJ's International Computer Hacking and Intellectual Property (ICHIP) Attorney based in Bucharest, Romania. His coverage area includes Eastern, Central, and Southern Europe, as well as Central Asia, and he focuses on building intellectual property enforcement capacity. He is on detail from his permanent position as an Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) for the District of the Virgin Islands, where he served as that District's Senior Litigation Counsel, focusing on white-collar crimes, corruption, and computer crimes. Prior to becoming an AUSA, Mr. Brooks was a Trial Attorney at the Department of Justice's Tax Division where he was twice named a DOJ "Outstanding Attorney" and was selected to instruct other federal prosecutors at DOJ's National Advocacy Center. Mr. Brooks was formerly an editorial board member of *The Federal Lawyer* magazine, and he has taught criminal justice courses at a number of domestic and international institutions.
