Mary D. Rodriguez is the General Counsel at INTERPOL, the world's largest international police organization with 194 member countries headquartered in Lyon, France. She is seconded to INTERPOL from the United States Department of Justice (DOJ). She directs the Office of Legal Affairs which advises INTERPOL's governing bodies, operational units, and member countries on international police cooperation, information sharing, and governance. Ms. Rodriguez established and oversees a multi-disciplinary Task Force to ensure legal compliance for INTERPOL's fugitive alert system. A former prosecutor with the United States Attorneys' Office in the District of Columbia, and Trial Attorney with DOJ's Civil Rights Division, she also served as Acting Director of DOJ's Office of International Affairs, where she led over 100 lawyers and staff handling international extraditions and mutual legal assistance for the United States government.
